



Respecting Diversity

Due to globalization and multi-polarization, patients' needs have become more diverse. The ability to practice nursing while respecting diverse values has become a must. The Graduate School of Nursing at Shimane Prefectural University has developed in response to these changes in society, to be closer to the way of life that people seek. In 2016, we established four fields of study in the Master's Course for Researcher Training: Cancer Nursing, Rehabilitation of the Elderly, Psychiatric Nursing, and Community Health. In addition, the fields of Midwifery and Clinical Nurse Practitioner were established as advanced practitioner training courses in 2020.

The purpose of the Master's Course is to develop excellent nurse practitioners who can lead community healthcare with research skills that allow them to explore independently, and to enable students to explore nursing that responds to a wide range of community health issues, from perinatal care to the elderly.

In the doctoral program, students are trained to become nursing educators and researchers who can lead the future of community health care and insurance. Join us in creating the nursing required in this new era.

Graduate School of North East Asian and Development Studies

The Graduate School of North East Asia and Development Studies offers a Master's Program in North East Asian Studies, a Master's Program in Regional Development Policy, and a Doctoral Program in Trans-Area Studies on North East Asia. The North East Asian Studies program and North East Asia and Trans-Area Studies program focus on regional studies in North East Asia, including China, North and South Korea, Mongolia, Russia, and Japan. The school conducts research on a trans-regional level. This is much more than a simple collection of individual studies on each region. The North East Asian region has been built through multi-lateral interaction between people and exchange of commodities. As we look to the future, globalization and internationalization of each region progresses. It is imperative to conduct interdisciplinary studies surpassing the framework of individual fields such as the humanities and social sciences. The Regional Development Policy program conducts interdisciplinary studies on issues relating to various fields of regional development while utilizing a diverse range of social sciences, including economics, politics, sociology, law and anthropogeography. Special attention is given to policy issues relating to declining birth rates, aging society, depopulation, decentralization, regional economic stimulus, and development of mountainous areas. These issues are serious concerns in Shimane Prefecture and the rest of Japan. They have not only surfaced as policy issues in Japan, but in North East Asia as well. By resolving these issues, it will be possible to contribute to the North East Asian region. Though the graduate school centers on individual research conducted by students, members also receive detailed guidance from their professors and other faculty as well.

NORTH EAST ASIAN RESEARCH (NEAR CENTER)

What is the Institute for North East Asian Research?

The Institute for North East Asian Research (NEAR Center) is an institute annexed to the University which conducts academic studies concerning North East Asia. NEAR Center researches present day issues of the region, including environmental problems beyond national borders and security issues, from a multifaceted approach.

NEAR Center Citizen Researchers

This program was established in 2006 in order to promote exchanges between NEAR researchers and citizens through research. In addition to encouraging joint research between citizens and graduate students, it aims to actively incorporate the knowledge of North East Asia into graduate education, knowledge which had been steadily accumulating outside the campus. This system has become the focus of attention from all over Japan as a new attempt by a research institution to contribute to the local community and graduate school education.






Welcome to Shimane - Your Future Home
